THIS WORKSHOP WILL RAISE ISSUES OF COLLECTIVE MEMORY, POLITICS OF HERITAGE, AND HISTORIC URBAN LANDSCAPE AS THEY HAVE SHAPED TODAY'S CITY. IT WILL QUESTION THE WAYS IN WHICH ARCHITECTURE HAS BEEN INSTRUMENTALIZED TO SHAPE A PARTICULAR HISTORIC NARRATIVE WITHIN CONTESTED CITIES, THEREBY EXCLUDING ENTIRE POPULATIONS IN A VIOLENT PROCESS OF SELECTION AND OMISSION OF MEMORIES, POPULATIONS, AND COMMUNITIES.

THE WORKSHOP WILL BEGIN WITH A LECTURE THAT LOOKS AT JERUSALEM AS A CASE STUDY FOR THE HISTORIC URBAN LANDSCAPE. IT WILL EXPLORE THE CONCEPT OF VALORISATION ACCORDING TO HISTORIAN FRANCOISE CHOAY AND KARL MARX, AS WELL AS THE NOTION OF COLLECTIVE MEMORY AS THEORISED BY PHILOSOPHER MAURICE HALBWACHS IN ORDER TO OPEN THE DISCUSSION TO THE WAYS ATHENS HAS BEEN GOING THROUGH A SIMILAR PROCESS OF MEMORIALISATION. IT WILL ALSO DISCUSS THE COMMODIFICATION OF HERITAGE AND THE TRANSFORMATION OF HISTORIC SITES INTO A CONSUMABLE ATTRACTION UNDER THE REGIME OF MASS TOURISM, A PROCESS THAT RESULTED IN THE DRAINING OF CULTURAL VALUES AND THEIR REPLACEMENT BY WHAT WALTER BENJAMIN CALLS THE RELIGION OF CAPITALISM.

AFTER THE LECTURE, STUDENTS WOULD BE INVITED TO EXPLORE THE CITY THROUGH THIS LENS AND BRING THEIR OWN OBSERVATIONS USING VARIOUS MEDIA, WITH AN EMPHASIS ON PHOTO-GRAPHY AND SHORT TEXTS. THE WORKSHOP WILL CONCLUDE WITH A REVIEW OF THEIR OBSERVATIONS AND A DISCUSSION ON THE DIFFERENCES AND SIMILARITIES BETWEEN JERUSALEM AND ATHENS.
